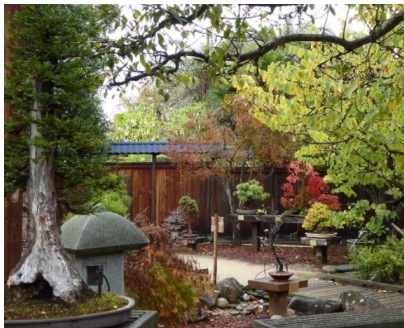
GSBF Convention in Sacramento
