# President's Special Message

On November 30, 2018, MBC received an email from the executive director of the Marin Art & Garden Center (MAGC), Antonia Adezio. It addressed several issues impacting directly on MBC's continuance of having its monthly meetings and workshops at MAGC.

First, effective January 1, 2019, the Multi-Purpose Room would no longer be available for rent by MBC due to planned renovation of administration office space. Secondly, the rental of the Livermore Pavilion, instead of Multi-Purpose Room, on a Tuesday night is \$140 per hour for November – March and \$205 for April – October. It is a considerable increase over rental cost for our use. And finally, MBC was required to remove its storage shed by the end of February 2019.

MBC has enjoyed some 15 years of using the MAGC facilities in Ross. Memories of past fall shows, summer auctions, monthly meetings and workshops are all that remains. The Board members were left with the heavy decision to take actions in locating suitable new facilities. A number of suggestions were circulated; however, MBC's past two years' experience with conducting the summer auctions at the [Tera Linda Community Center \(TLCC\)](#) helped substantially in narrowing the focus and ultimate selection.

After a series of conversations, we were granted permission to use the **MAGC Multi-Purpose Room for the meetings and repotting workshops scheduled on January 8, 15, February 5 and 19.** For the repotting workshops, please RSVP as usual so that we can be prepared to handle everyone's needs. Please limit your repotting to two small to medium or one large bonsai per session. Soil is available for purchase, or you may bring your own.

On **January 8, 2019**, MBC will conduct its meeting at the MAGC Multi-Purpose Room. The program will feature Jonas Dupuich ([bonsaitonight.com](#)) discussing deadwood features in bonsai and demonstrating some carving techniques. Come join us for the start of the new year's scheduled programs.

Effectively **March 5**, MBC will conduct all its meetings, workshops, beginners' workshop one and two, and summer auction at the TLCC location - 670 Del Ganado Road, San Rafael. Those members who participated in the summer auctions for the past two years will be familiar with the space.

We have completed a new and exciting schedule of programs for 2019. All together there will be 18 dates at TLCC, this includes meetings, workshops, beginners' workshops one and two, and the August auction. Refer to the MBC website for posted events at <http://marinbonsaiclub.org>
