I wish to mention the very sad news of Peter Makepeace's passing a few days ago. Peter was a member of the Marin Bonsai Club for a relative short time, only 2yrs. He was willing to take on any task given him. Peter participated in club meetings and workshops on a regular basis. He will be missed.

With December comes the Holiday Season and closing of the books on 2020. It is supposed to be a merry and cheerful time of the year. It can be if we focus on the positive things that surround us.

I hope everyone is healthy and safe from the coronavirus pandemic of 2020. Hope is on my mind for 2021 and for the lifting of the pandemic restrictions that plagued us throughout this year.

On November 7, Marin Bonsai Club conducted its fundraising sale at the outdoors basketball court behind the Terra Linda Community Center. The weather was perfect for our event. A total of 18 members and one professional vendor (Matthew Walker) sold items that included: bonsai, pre-bonsai, pots galore, soil, wire, tools, and more. A new member to the club (Mikel Edward) sold his new, hand-crafted line of bonsai pots. The fundraiser occurred from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and grossed \$4,070, of which the club earned \$1,661. Suggestions were made that next year the club should invite other Bay Area bonsai clubs to participate in the sale, thus increasing the number of buyers as members from the other clubs would be present. A special thanks to all the sellers, volunteer helpers, buyers, and supporters who made the fundraising event a success.

The 2021 MBC programs committee (Craig Thompson, Marcia Summers and Gwynessa Aetherwyn) have been busy the past couple of months working on scheduling professional instructors for bonsai presentations. Because COVID-19 pandemic will continue to be with us for months to come, it was important to schedule instructors capable of doing Zoom meetings/presentations. What does the Task Master Say about November?

When frost comes, or freezing below 36° for too many hours, put the pots under the eaves of the house or under their benches and protect from wind. Tropicals and the smaller pots and tender plants need protection when the temperature goes below 40°. But some trees fruit better or flower

better if they get a light frost now and then, so just keep a close eye on the actual weather, not just the weather report.

The passing of Peter Makepeace

Dear Marin Bonsai Club Members,

It's with a broken and grieving heart I announce the passing of my partner, Peter Harper Makepeace. Peter died surrounded by loved ones early in the morning on Thursday, November 19, 2020 at home in Fairfax.

Peter was born in Washington DC on October 6, 1964. The son of a diplomat working in the Foreign Service, Peter spent his early childhood living abroad in Turkey and India. He went to school at the Potomac School and Middlesex on the east coast. Peter came to California to start his college career and started a family here and never left. He attended UC Berkeley, then graduated from the Art Institute of San Francisco with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in 1988.

Peter was a sweet, gentle, funny soul who loved talking about history, politics and film. Peter inherited his artistic gifts from his mother and was a talented and passionate filmmaker, artist and keeper of bonsais. Peter joined the Marin Bonsai Club when we moved to Fairfax in 2018. He and his bonsais escaped the wind and fog of San Francisco and his bonsai collection grew and thrived in the sunshine in Marin. Excited about a Tuesday night meeting, he would make up silly songs about 'bonsai night'. Peter's bonsai skills grew under the mentorship of expert club members and he cherished the friendships he made there. When I got terrible news from the hospital, I called bonsai friend Lake. She took my car keys and drove us to the hospital. She stood by me during my shock and anguish and comforted Peter-a true friend to Peter and I for which I'll always be grateful.

When Peter became gravely ill, his son, daughter and sister flew in from as far away as NY and Japan. Their care for him in his final days was a beautiful testament to their love for him. When Peter came home from the hospital, we still held on to some hope for his recovery, but this hope faded too quickly.

For several days, Peter was fully conscious-talking, joking, staying up late watching a movie with his kids, zooming and visiting friends. I'm grateful that we all had this time to be with Peter, but so pained that his time with us healthy and enjoying life was too short.

Peter is survived by his partner, Michelle of Fairfax, CA; daughter Hanako of Tokyo, Japan; son Will of Brooklyn, NY; ex-wife and dear friend Hiromi of Honolulu, HI; sister Anne of London/NY; brother Tim of Washington, DC; four

nieces and nephews; and many cousins and extended family. He will also be mourned by the many friends he made in every season of his life. We'll keep him in our hearts and feel his spirit amongst the trees.
