STATUS OF NONPROFIT CORPORATION 501 (C)(3) TAX EXEMPTION

MBC has completed filing applications to the State and Federal Internal Revenue Service for the purpose of obtaining full compliance by being nonprofit corporation 501(c)(3) tax exempt.

The club will again resume its revenue generating activities when it receives certifications from the government agencies. However, IRS reports having a short staff

and backlog of 95,000 applications which will delay that agency's response.

The State should respond in a timely manner. I want to thank Marcia Summers, MBC Treasurer, and Art Wasserman, former MBC Treasurer, for their input and efforts to ensure the complete and thorough filing of government forms and finance reports. Below is a table of all filings, to date. ■
