CRITICAL TREE EVALUATION



He's baaaack! The long awaited return of Jonas Dupuich of **Bonsai Tonight** fame will be September 5 at the Terra Linda Community Center. One of our most popular presenters will be discussing how to evaluate bonsai trees, both at exhibitions and for possible purchase and inclusion in your bonsai collections. If you think you know a good bonsai tree when you see one, think again. Jonas will guide us through how to look at trees critically and assess their potential. Everyone is sure to pick up some new considerations regarding the quality of a tree and it's future as a bonsai.

For many of us Jonas needs no introduction, but for the newbies out there here are the Cliff Notes: Jonas has been a bonsai professional for over 15 years, and before that was a deeply engaged student and a foundational member of the Bay Island Bonsai club

headed by professional Boon Manakitivipart. He started his *Bonsai Tonight* blog to share his processes and explorations in bonsai, and after 20 years still posts indispensable knowledge in his weekly posts. (Anyone who is not signed up to receive these posts is really missing out.) You may also know Jonas as the co-creator of the wildly successful Pacific Bonsai Expo which had its inaugural show this past November. Or you might know Jonas for his excellent bonsai primer *The Little Book of Bonsai*. We are fortunate to have Jonas as part of the Bay Area bonsai community and a local resource for both bonsai wisdom and supplies.
