


PACIFIC BONSAI EXPORECAP

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What a year it has been so far. We have done so much this year as a club. My first year as president has been full of surprises and learning moments. But most of all, I love the wonderful moments that all of we have had with each other through bonsai. I am grateful to have met a wonderful and enthusiastic club.

As a club, we brought our membership up to 62 active members this year from 42 last year. Our outreach and Beginners' programs have inspired many new folks to join our club as well as pick up a new and rewarding hobby. This would not have been possible if it weren't for our dedicated senior members who taught the beginners workshops and the new members, of course.

Our club treasury has increased from around \$5000 at the beginning of the year to about \$8500 by the end of the year. This is a result of our fantastic Sale in August, raffles, and—most importantly—club support. It would not have been possible without our club dues. It also would not have been possible without club members leading demonstrations from time to time. I hope to raise this to a comfortable \$12,000 by end of next year.

All that said, I hope we will take our club into a bright new year and share our love of little trees in pots with Marin and beyond. In order to that, I'll need the help of every single one of you to make it happen. Thank you, all!






