


Jay McDonald, long time Marin Bonsai Club member and bonsai professional, will headline our June 6 meeting with a presentation of some of his best trees.


LAKE MERRITT EYE CANDY

DECIDUOUS TREE DEMO

A big thank you to our May program presenters, John Doig, Dan Keller and Chris Ross. These Marin Bonsai Senior members put on a terrific program discussing a range of deciduous trees, how they are grown, developed and styled for bonsai.

Chris started with a winged euonymus describing some of the quirks associated with developing the species for bonsai, and the ultimate rewards of having them in members' collections.

Dan followed with a remarkable story of the development of his root over rock trident maple he grew from seed, with members chiming in with often amusing antidotes they had observed during the long process.

John Doig told the story of his Chinese elm development illustrated with a half dozen trees shown at different years and stages of development. Following the presentation the panel reviewed trees brought in by members — commenting and making suggestions for improvement.

So much information was shared for members to work with and increase their understanding of bonsai training, and we look forward to seeing success stories inspired by the knowledge gained and creatively applied at future meetings and workshops.


SEI BOKU BONSAI KAI SHOW
