MARIN COUNTY FAIR

Great news, everyone! We have been invited to exhibit at the Marin County Fair on July 3-7. We have been talking with the fair organizers to make the show come to life. I think we have an exciting show planned and we'll need all the help we can get to make it happen.

The theme for this year's fair will be **Making** A Splash. We will be exhibiting alongside the Fine Arts and Textiles exhibits in the Exhibit Hall. We will be expecting a very large, enthusiastic, and curious crowd.

I would like to thank John Doig and Janice Dilbeck for being our show organizers. They will direct our display space set up. I would also like to thank Susan Sullivan for being our liaison with the fair organizers. Please give them a warm thank you for helping the club out with this task.

In addition to our **Formal Tree Display**, we will have several new sub-exhibits as volunteers allow.

The first is a **Work In Progress** display area. Here, our trees in various stages of development can be shown to show visitors the process of creating a bonsai. Everyone is welcome to contribute to this section, especially our newer members who may not have a formal tree. We also plan to make educational posters that illustrate various bonsai concepts.

The second is a **Bonsai Insights: Studio Conversations** area. Here, we work on our

trees as visitors come up to watch us work, ask questions, and see how we transform our trees into a show-ready tree. I have always loved the curiosity that visitors have because so few get to see how a bonsai is created and many will have questions. This will be a wonderful engaging mini-program.

Lastly, we will have a **Make Your Own Bonsai** area where visitors can get to create their first bonsai in an informal atmosphere. Who doesn't want a hands-on experience with bonsai, especially at the fair? It embodies the spirit of the fair by allowing visitors to experience the joy of creating something beautiful with their own hands.

We will need everyone to contribute to make this show a success—trees, docents, set-up, teachers, and more.

ADAM TOTH'S DEMO

For our April meeting on the 2nd, Adam Toth will discuss the development of deciduous bonsai. As we are all seeing buds popping and internodes lengthening on our maples, elms, and fruiting and flowering trees this spring, it is a good idea to check in and make sure we are doing the right work at the appropriate time. Adam will bring some of his trees to talk about and we are suggesting members bring in a deciduous tree to discuss as well. There is no promise Adam will have time to get to each tree or provide much detail, but it will be instructive to see examples of work—good and not so good—on members' trees.

Adam fell in love with bonsai over 10 years ago and now, after apprenticing for over 3 years with Taiga Urushibata at the Taisho-en bonsai

garden in Shizuoka, Japan he has returned to the U.S. and established himself as a well-respected young professional. He has been a frequent guest artist at bonsai meetings and conventions in the Bay Area and beyond, and has been leading workshop groups as well. He particularly likes working on shohin and mame bonsai, but received a well rounded education in Japan and is adept at working on all bonsai species.

INSIGHTS INTO THE PACIFIC BONSAI EXPO AND TIPS FOR ENTRY

Our March 5th meeting with Eric Schrader from Bonsaify was an eye opener! The first half of the lecture focused on the last Pacific Bonsai Expo. Here are some of the highlights from the lecture.

The location selected for the 2023 show had many windows and special considerations had to be taken into account as the natural light on the exhibits changed throughout the day. Shadows cast often produced dramatic effects, and emphasized the spectacular colors on the deciduous trees! Much thought was put into the placement of the trees to make the best use of the unusual lighting.

Eric discussed the construction of the backdrop and the months it took to find a fabric that was the right color and would not snag in a long, seamless run. The backdrop frame had to be sanded to prevent snags and all edges of fabric finished. It took 10 people to feed 70 plus feet of fabric into a sewing machine so that there would be no visible seams. These are just a few of the many details that went into making the show so professional and beautiful.

Eric showed slides of the exhibits and gave detailed explanations of which entries won and why. Also discussed was the criteria the judges were given for the show in selecting entries and winners. It was amazing to see the examples of years of careful work and artistry.

The second half of the lecture focused on the work one would need to do for their tree to be accepted for the 2024 PBE. All requirements are on the Bonsai Tonight website. The following are some of the tips Eric offered:

- Entrants can submit as many entries as they want but only 3 at most can be chosen.
- Good quality photos are essential!
- If you have deciduous trees make sure you submit a photo with the tree's fall color along with a picture of it in winter

silhouette.

- Submit photos of the tree straight on as well as from the side and maybe even one taken from underneath the branches.
- Use soft lighting with a white or black background.
- The more pictures the better.
- There is no limit to the number of Shohin bonsai that can be submitted and they can be submitted separately or together.
- Exhibits can be created in conjunction with another person.
- Suiseki, sculpture, Ikebana are all acceptable as companion pieces to the main bonsai tree.
- The tree does not need to be in show condition for the entry photo. However, if it is deciduous, it should have a photo from the growing season. Similarly, the intended pot it will be displayed in should be submitted.

Please check the **submission guidelines** for the latest and most up-to-date information.

Even if I don't aspire to enter a national exhibition like the Pacific Bonsai Expo, Eric's presentation made me think about my own newly created trees and how I might display them in the spaces in my yard.

Also during the meeting, Jay McDonald brought in several trees for discussion at the break and a large crowd gathered around him asking questions and picking up expert tips on bonsai development. We will see a couple of the azaleas he previewed at his presentation in May, one of them to be raffled off during the meeting.
